Dear Senator Block:

The California Association of Clerks and Election Officials (CACEO) Elections Legislative Committee has reviewed **SB 183** (as **introduced February 7, 2011**), your proposal to require the elections official to duplicate and count any ballot where the voter placed personal information on the ballot that identifies the voter.

The Committee voted to Support this bill, if amended to remove the requirement that the elections official duplicate all ballots with identifiable information, and only require the ballot to be duplicated in order to capture the voter's intent. The elections official would still be required to duplicate all ballots in situations where the voter has made a correction to their ballot and the intent of the voter must be captured, in addition to ballots that were torn, damaged or otherwise unreadable. Concerns of voter privacy would be unwarranted as most official ballots are never seen by the public and the identity of the voter who has placed marks on their ballot will not be disclosed. In the event of a recount, it would be necessary to prove that the identifiable marks on the ballot were actually meant to identify the voter, and because the voted ballot is separate from the vote by mail ballot return envelope or the voter's signature on the roster, this would be near impossible. Amending the bill to avoid unnecessary ballot duplication steps saves costs associated with staff and additional election supplies, as well as expedites the canvass of the vote and certification of results.
