Guaranteed Room Rate: \$154/single or double (\$129 plus occupancy tax and village/resort fees covering: inroom high speed internet, heated/underground parking, and fitness center access.)

Number of Rooms Blocked: 7/18 - 19 (Mon/Tues): 75 rooms each, 7/20 - 7/21 (Wed/Thur): 120 rooms each

*Note: the hotel has agreed to offer the same room rate should anyone wish to check in the weekend just prior to the Conference or stay the weekend following the Conference. This is on a "Space Available" basis. While we encourage you to decide and book your room early, we must request that, if for financial reasons you need to



<u>cancel a night or two, you do so well in advance of the Conference.</u> This way, another member can get the special room rate AND the Association will not be responsible to cover the cost of your room!! (The Association can loose thousands of dollars due to last minute cancellations or "no shows".)



Deluxe One Bedroom Suites: The Village is an "all suite" property, meaning all room accommodations have both a spacious living room, separate bedroom, and private balcony. All suites are approximately 600 square feet and come furnished with a queen size sofa sleeper and a cozy fireplace. Adjacent to the living room is a dining room with table and chairs. Kitchens contain cooking

utensils, refrigerator, dishwasher, microwave and range. To top it off, a "hydronic" heating system is used to heat the slate tiles on the kitchen and bathroom floors – you might even leave your slippers at home!!! There are also two and three bedroom suites available, at a higher price, of course.

Squaw Valley: As any geography major will tell you, the official name is Olympic Valley. Squaw Valley is the shortened name of the Lake Tahoe ski resort. If you aren't familiar with Squaw Valley's other attributes, you're in for a treat. This recreational wonderland revolves around the Village at Squaw Valley. In the summer, you can enjoy water sports, river rafting, golf, fishing, biking, hiking, horseback riding and more.
