SUMMARY:	Clarifies that a conclusive presumption regarding the residence address of a Member of the State Legislature or a Representative in Congress applies only if the address on the person's affidavit is a place where the person's habitation is fixed for some period of time. Requires the Attorney General to investigate and prosecute any violation of existing penal provisions regarding a fraudulent vote or fraudulent attempt to vote in a jurisdiction in which the person does not reside for voting purposes.

AB 278 (Continued): SUMMARY:	100,000 or more to adopt an ordinance, without submitting the ordinance to the voters of the city for approval, for the election of members of the legislative body by district. Requires that the boundary lines of each district be adjusted in accordance with specified provisions of existing law. Requires that the proposed boundaries satisfy specified criteria.

Prohibits the use of a certain district-based election if it would impair the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice. Requires a court to implement specified remedies in certain cases.

Permits a candidate who alleges to be indigent and unable to pay the requisite fee to submit a statement of financial worth to the Secretary of State for consideration, and requires the Secretary of State to furnish the statement of financial worth to a candidate within a prescribed period and to determine whether a candidate who has submitted the statement is in fact indigent. Requires a candidate found not to be indigent to pay the filing fee within a prescribed time. Specifies that a candidate found to be indigent is not required to pay the fee to appear on the ballot.

SUMMARY:	Permits a candidate for Member of the Legislature to file a statement with the Secretary of State in which the candidate voluntarily agrees that, if elected, he or she will continue to reside within the district from which he or she was elected during his or her term of office. Authorizes the Secretary of State to post on his or her Internet Web site voluntary statements of continuing residency filed with the secretary, as described.

Specifies that the statement does not count toward the 100-word limit and authorizes any elector to seek a writ of mandate challenging the inclusion of the statement.

Requires the ballot to be received no later than the closing of polls on election day. Provides these measures will become operative after all security issues have been addressed.

Requires the Governor to rescind the proclamation calling for the special election if a special primary election or a special general election is canceled because a candidate has been declared elected, as specified. Clarifies that a candidate is declared elected by the Secretary of State.

Requires the Secretary to report certain information regarding the success of such elections to the Legislature and a task force to review such elections.
