CACEO POSITION:	Pending
SUMMARY:	Requires that a write-in candidate for a voter-nominated office receive votes at the direct primary election equal in number to at least 1% of all votes cast for the office at the last preceding general election at which the office was filled in order for his or her name to be placed on the general election ballot as a candidate for that office.

**AB 149 Registering to Vote: Persons Formerly Incarcerated

SUMMARY:	States the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to inform each person who completes all orders of imprisonment that the person may be entitled to register to vote and to provide information to the person on the procedures for registering to vote and a copy of a voter registration application.

**AB 193 Municipal Ballot Measures: Arguments

SUMMARY:	Requires city elections officials to give preference and priority to the arguments of the legislative body, or a member or members of the legislative body authorized by that body, if the arguments are in favor of a measure that is placed on the ballot by the legislative body.

SUMMARY:	Requires the Secretary of State to establish procedures and publish guidelines for voting in the event of a natural disaster or other state of emergency. Requires the Secretary of State to report to the Legislature on the readiness of the state to hold elections during or following a natural disaster or other state of emergency.

SUMMARY:	Declares the intent of Legislature to increase penalties for failing to properly disclose campaign contributions, tighten the disclosure requirements on mass mailings, and campaign messages presented through television, and other forms of media, and closes the loophole associated with campaign contributions from multipurpose groups and nonprofit organizations.

**SB 3 Political Reform Act of 1974: Campaign Disclosures

SUMMARY:	Declares the intent of Legislature to increase disclosure penalties and to strengthen and modify specified existing disclosure requirements and campaign contribution provisions as they relate to particular groups and organizations.

SUMMARY:	Provides that any vote by mail ballot is timely cast if it is received by the voter's elections official no later than 3 days after election day, and either the ballot is postmarked on or before election day or, if the ballot has no postmark, a postmark with no date, or an illegible postmark, the vote by mail ballot identification envelope is signed and dated on or before election day.
