SUMMARY:	Requires the legislative body of a general law city with a population of 100,000 or more to adopt an ordinance, without submitting the ordinance to the voters of the city for approval, for the election of members of the legislative body by district. Requires that the boundary lines of each district be adjusted in accordance with specified provisions of existing law. Requires that the proposed boundaries satisfy specified criteria.

SUMMARY:	Amends existing law which prohibits the use of an at-large election in a political subdivision if it would impair the ability of a protected class to elect candidates or otherwise influence the outcome of an election, and which provides that certain voters may bring certain actions in superior court. Prohibits the use of a certain district-based election if it would impair the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice. Requires a court to implement specified remedies in certain cases.

SUMMARY:	Requires the Attorney General to include a specified title and summary if it is believed the measure would result in a constitutional right violation. Specifies that the statement does not count toward the 100-word limit and authorizes any elector to seek a writ of mandate challenging the inclusion of the statement.

Exempts these acts from the criminal and civil penalties in existing law. Repeals a duplicate provision. Exempts from a crime in existing law a person examining or soliciting a voter to show a photograph or digital image of his or her marked ballot using certain means.

Prohibits a person designated to return a vote by mail ballot from

SUMMARY:	Authorizes a United States citizen who is 17 years of age, is a resident of the state, and will be at least 18 years of age at the time of the next general election to vote in any intervening primary or special election that occurs before the next general election.

SUMMARY:	Authorizes a person who is at least 16 years of age and a resident of the

SUMMARY:	Authorizes the Governor to declare a candidate for a legislative office elected if only one candidate for the legislative office qualifies to have his or her name printed on the special primary election ballot, and cancels the special primary election and special general election if the Governor declares such a candidate elected. Requires the Governor to rescind the proclamation calling for the special election if a special primary election or a special general election is canceled because a candidate has been declared elected, as specified. Clarifies that a candidate is declared elected by the Secretary of State.

SUMMARY:	Authorizes a county to conduct any election as an all-mailed ballot election if certain conditions are satisfied, including conditions related to ballot dropoff locations and vote centers. Requires a county that conducts such an election to report certain information to the Legislature and the Secretary of State regarding all-mailed ballot elections. Requires the Secretary to report certain information regarding the success of such elections to the Legislature and a task force to review such elections.

SUMMARY:	Requires a homeless shelter that registers a person to vote to keep a record of the person it has registered to vote, including certain information about the person, and to transmit that information to certain government entities at least once per year. Authorizes an applicant who is a homeless individual to list the shelter, public space, cross street, or post office where he or she is living as his or her address on a driver's license or identification card.

SUMMARY:	Establishes the Citizens Redistricting Commission in the County of Los Angeles, which would be charged with adjusting the boundary lines of the districts of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles. Provides that the commission would consist of 14 members who meet specified qualifications. Requires the commission to adjust the boundaries of the supervisorial districts in accordance with specified criteria and adopt a redistricting plan, which would become effective 30 days following its submission to the county elections official. Makes legislative findings and declarations as to the necessity of a special statute for the unique circumstances facing the County of Los Angeles.

Requires in such a county, the county charter to provide the expenditures for the governing body and its staff may not exceed a specified formula. Extends these requirements to a general law county with the same population factors.
