SUMMARY:	Establishes an Internet Voting Pilot Program under which a county may offer Internet voting as an additional method of voting in a local election held within the county, provided specified conditions apply. Requires, before a county may conduct a pilot program, the county must test the program, as specified. Requires the Secretary of State to certify and Internet voting system before it may be used by a county in conducting a pilot program. Requires in order to certify the Internet voting system, the Secretary of State must conduct a top-to-bottom review of the system and report on the system's accuracy, security, integrity, efficacy, and accessibility. Provides that if a county conducts a pilot program, the county must evaluate the program and the county's experience with the voting system and to report thereon to the Legislature and the Secretary of State.

Prescribes the procedures allowing for a specified provisional ballot to be counted.

Requires the clerk of the superior court of each county, to provide to the chief elections official of the county, not less frequently than the first day of April and the first day September of each year, a statement showing the name, address, date of birth, and, if available, the last four digits of the social security number of each person who has been convicted of a felony and sentenced to state or federal prison since the clerk's last report. Requires the county elections official, during the first week of April and the first week of September in each year, to cancel the affidavit of a registration of each person who is currently imprisoned or on state or federal parole for a felony conviction and is listed clerk's statement, as specified.

Provides that if a candidate for a nonpartisan office at a primary election receives a majority of all votes cast for that office, the candidate shall be elected to that office, and the office shall not appear on the ballot at the ensuing general election.

Requires the Secretary of State, not less than 73 days, and not more than 98 days, before a general election, to notify each candidate for a partisan office or voter-nominated office of the names, addresses, offices, ballot designation, and party preferences of all other persons whose names are to appear on the ballot for the same office at the general election. Corrects erroneous statutory cross-references pertaining to vote by mail ballots cast by military or overseas voters. Repeals existing law that requires the county elections official to prepare a list of candidates for presidential delegates for each political party, submit a copy of the list to the chairperson of the county central committee of the political party, and post a copy of the list in the elections official's office.
