What is CalPEAC? California has one of the most diverse voter populations carrying with it unique challenges in election administration. Preparing California's election administrators to meet these challenges is the reason the California Association of Clerks and Election Officials (CACEO) created the California Professional Election Administrator Credential Program (CalPEAC). Upon completion of the program's 10 courses, participants will be conferred the CalPEAC Credential and be known as a Registered Election Official (REO). Each course addresses a different component of election administration and is instructed by a professional with experience in the subject area.

This course covers all aspects of precincts and polling places including redistricting, precinct changes, accessibility laws and regulations, and the use of mitigations.

MANAGING THE ELECTION OFFICE *Jill LaVine, Retired Sacramento County ROV, Instructor* This course provides an overview of elections administration and includes budgeting, purchasing, calendaring and staffing and helpful hints and examples.

HOW TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT NEW LEGISLATION *Elections Legislative Committee Members, Instructors* This course covers legislation from its inception to its implementation. Learn how to market your idea, navigate through the different committees, make amendments, and what it takes to enact a new law.

COURSE TEN

2020 – NOT JUST A PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION YEAR Karin Mac Donald, Director Statewide Database, Instructor This course covers the US Census, the American Communities Survey, and other data that is used by counties during redistricting. It also will discuss the steps for redistricting and the steps election offices need to take to ensure a smooth process.
