


**SB 450 Elements** 




### What do Voters Think?

6,433 responses out of 42,000 surveys sent to November 2016 voters









### Convenience

53% of voters indicated they used a vote center to 'avoid Election Day rush"

### Use Again

90% of voters indicated they would use a vote center over a polling place in the future

### Very Satisfied

96% of voters indicated they were "very satisfied" or "satisfied" with their vote center experience

### Vote In-Person

79% of voters who used a vote center indicated they normally vote in-person

Strong community support among a variety of organizations




















